- Review and make recommendations on any proposed changes to the plan, prior to the Transportation Agency Board consideration;
- Prepare annual reports regarding the administration of the program, to be presented to the Transportation Agency Board of Directors and available for public review.

This action item calls for the nomination and the election of a Chair and Vice Chair of the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee to serve effective January 2021 for a two-year term.

SUMMARY:

The Blue Zones Project is a community-by-community well-being improvement initiative designed to help people lead longer, better lives by making healthy choices easier. The initiative promotes simple permanent or semi-permanent changes to community, organization and home environments that support healthy lifestyle behaviors and habits based on Blue Zones cultures.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

None.

DISCUSSION:

Blue Zones Project Monterey County is a community-by-community well-being improvement initiative designed to help people lead longer, better lives by making healthy choices easier. The initiative promotes simple permanent or semi-permanent changes to community, organization and home environments that support healthy lifestyle behaviors and habits based on Blue Zones cultures.

The Blue Zones initiative is sponsored by the Salinas Valley Memorial Healthcare System, Montage Health, and Taylor Farms. The Transportation Agency has been very involved in this project: the Executive Director serves on the Steering Committee, and staff serves on the Schools and Built Environment committees to support TAMC's safe routes to schools program and bicycle/pedestrian safety improvement activities.

Phase 1 of *Blue Zones Project Monterey County*, launched in Salinas in 2018. However, the sponsors' intent was always to have the effort be countywide. In January 2021, program officials announced the project is expanding countywide, with the assistance of Dan Burden, a nationally recognized authority on walkability and bike-ability.

Mr. Burden led field trips to South County cities and the Monterey Peninsula, and made a presentation to the Transportation Agency's Board of Directors in February 2020 on *Blue Zones Project Monterey County* activities, which included ideas for reducing pedestrian and bicyclist injuries and fatalities, and strategies for improving community health through active transportation.

His presentation to the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee will illustrate how Measure X funding (primarily the

local share) can be used to support safety and active transportation. Attached is Mr. Burden's bio.

Subject: Salinas Measure X Projects Update

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

RECEIVE presentation from the City of Salinas on Measure X funded projects in the city.

SUMMARY:

This presentation is an update on Measure X funded projects in the city and an explanation on how they meet the criteria of the Transportation Safety & Investment Plan, which is funded by Measure X sales tax proceeds.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Measure X Transportation Safety and Investment Plan was approved by over 2/3rd of voters in November 2016. The measure is anticipated to generate \$20 million annually with 60% of the revenues allocated to local jurisdictions.

DISCUSSION:

In October 2018, the City of Salinas' Public Works Director provided an update on their local Measure X Projects to the Measure X Citizens Oversight Committee. Much of the discussion after the presentation focused on the Main Street Improvement Project and how it met the criteria defined in the Transportation Safety & Investment Plan, which is funded by Measure X sales tax proceeds.

This presentation provides an update on the Main Street Improvement Project and other city projects funded by Measure X.

The City of Salinas has leveraged a portion of its Measure X distributions to make the annual debt service payments on the \$40.6-million in Total Road Improvement Program (TRIP) bonds the City received to fund transportation infrastructure improvements. The current budget for the Main Street project is approximately \$12-million, which is largely funded by TRIP funds. The primary scope of work is to make improvements to the Main Street streetscape to:

- Improve safety and increase mobility and access for all pedestrians, including seniors and persons with disabilities, by reconstructing sidewalks to be wider; reducing visual barriers; improving grades to be ADA compliant; improving lighting; enhancing crosswalks and installing accessible pedestrian signals with exclusive pedestrian signal operations and countdowns; integrating wayfinding devices and signage; installing bollards and other vehicular barriers to protect high pedestrian areas.
- Improve the pavement condition index, which is 43 for the 200 and 300 blocks and 61 for the 100 block.
- Reduce collision potential through traffic calming features, including narrower lanes and horizontal and vertical

deflection roadway alignment.

- Encourage safe cycling through the improved traffic circulation, increase visibility, and enhanced bicycle facilities I mprove vehicular circulation by converting the existing one-way traffic flow to two-way and modernizing signal equipment to efficiently move traffic.
- Encourage walking and improve visitor access to downtown businesses to support a healthy and vibrant downtown community.
- Improve the treatment and volume reduction of storm water runoff.

Subject: Measure X FY 2019/20 Annual Audit Update

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

RECEIVE an update on the results of the Measure X annual audit and compliance reporting for 2019/20.

SUMMARY:

The purpose of the Measure X annual audit is to confirm that the funding recipients -- TAMC, the County of Monterey and the twelve incorporated cities -- have complied with the voter-approved requirements specified in Ordinance 2016-01 for the Transportation Safety and Investment Plan. One of the responsibilities of the Measure X Transportation Oversight Committee is to review the independent audits of the jurisdictions, and prepare and present an annual report regarding the administration of the program. A subcommittee of the Oversight Committee reviewed the reports and staff will provide information on the receipt and review of annual audit compliance data.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Approved by 69% of the voters in 2016, Measure X was projected to generate an estimated \$20 million annually, for a total of \$600 million over thirty years or \$20 million per year. The funding source is a retail transactions and use tax of 3/8% per dollar spent. Actual revenues have been significantly higher, with 2018/19 receipts (the second full year of Measure X receipts) totaling \$30.5 million and 2019/20 dropping slightly to \$28.2 million. The latest estimates are that Measure X revenues are expected to drop to \$27.7 million in 2020/21, then rise again to \$29.4 million in 2021/22.

DISCUSSION:

The Transportation Agency has fiduciary responsibility for the administration of the voter-approved Transportation Safety and Investment Plan (Measure X) funds. Each jurisdiction entered into a tax sharing agreement with the Transportation Agency in order to receive their share of Measure X Local Streets & Roads revenues. In exchange, these agreements require the jurisdictions to submit audit reports annually to the Transportation Agency detailing the steps taken to comply with the implementing ordinance.

In accordance with the Policies & Project Descriptions for the Transportation Safety & Investment Plan, an Oversight Committee representing a diverse range of community interests was formed. The Measure X Transportation Oversight Committee established a subcommittee to conduct the review of the independent audits of the revenues and expenditure of Measure X funds. The subcommittee was asked to report the results of the audit to the full committee at their next meeting and to prepare the Measure X Annual Report.

The third year of Measure X reporting, for fiscal year 2019/20, was due on December 31, 2020. For this year's independent audits, there has again been a marked improvement in compliance by the jurisdictions from the previous

reporting period. All of the jurisdictions submitted their complete reports by the deadline. After an initial review of the reports, Agency staff has reached out to request more information from Sand City regarding not meeting their maintenance of effort requirement.
